Course description and Objectives	The course aims at a detailed knowledge of climate change (scientific data: origin, strength, consequences), diplomacy and international climate law (UNFCCC 1992, Kyoto Protocol 1997) and especially the Paris Agreement adopted in 2015. It aims to understand the international negotiation process of the COP 21, the diplomatic positions of the main actors (China, United States, European Union, developing countries,) but also the legal results obtained and more largely the legal mechanics of the Paris Agreement. It is imperative to understand and know the critical role of the ambition of the Paris Agreement as well as the nature, function and expected evolution of the Nationally determined contributions (NDC). More broadly, the course examines the issues for citizens of all countries to fight against climate change by changing very quickly in the coming years their individual behaviors. Issues will also be addressed with economic and trade issues and aspects of climate litigation in various countries.
